

# Multiple District 19 History

MD19: Serving Lions Clubs In British Columbia, Northern Idaho And Washington Since 1922

The first Lions Club
Convention was held in 1917 in
Dallas, Texas, with 36
delegates representing 22
clubs. In 1918, the first district
officers were appointed, with
the western states comprising
District One.

Lions became international in 1920 with the establishment of a club in Ontario, Canada. In 1921, Washington, Oregon, and British Columbia were formed into District 19. The first club in this area was likely the Everett Central Lions Club, chartered in 1920.

By 1923, District 19 had the required 8 clubs to be recognized as a full district. Key early clubs included Seattle, Tacoma, Spokane, Wenatchee, Vancouver, Bellingham, and Yakima.

In 1925, Oregon separated from District 19 to become District 36, leaving District 19 with 13 clubs and 830 members in Washington and British Columbia.
